Employees expect control over their work time and location, with flexibility being a top priority.



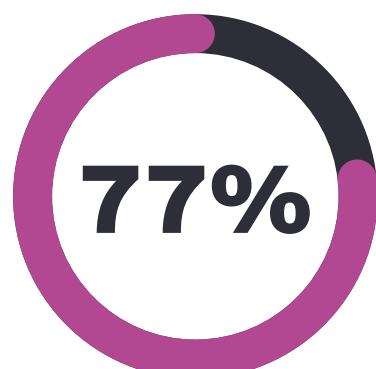
To retain top talent, organizations must continue to build a workplace culture that reflects the needs of employees.
