Overview/key issues

- ▶ With the number of confirmed cases and fatalities worldwide rising rapidly every day, many government authorities are enacting immigration-related measures to limit the spread of the COVID-19 pandemic and protect the health and safety of individuals in and outside of their countries.
- ▶ Measures being introduced to stem the spread of COVID-19 include the following:
 - ▶ Entry restrictions and heightened admission criteria for certain populations (including prohibitions on entry from high risk locations);
 - ▶ Mandatory “stay home notices” and quarantine orders for newly admitted citizens, residents and visitors (whether in state facilities, hotels or private residences);
 - ▶ Temporary suspension (and in some cases, permanent cancelation) of existing visas issued prior to COVID-19 and suspension of issuance of new visas; and
 - ▶ Introduction of heightened eligibility criteria and application requirements where visas are being issued (including suspension of visa waiver agreements and enhanced document requirements for new applications).

Next steps

Employers should focus on:

- ▶ Identifying local and globally mobile populations and their family members,
- ▶ Assessing the impact on local employees and global travelers, and
- ▶ Developing action plans for specific individuals, groups and locations.

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ All border crossings with neighboring countries are closed to travelers.
- ▶ Cargo is being allowed to enter into Albania.
- ▶ Citizens who are outside of Albania may enter Albania only if they are holding a permit issued by an Albanian consulate in the country where they are currently located.

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ Those allowed entry into the country must declare if they are traveling from an affected country and self-quarantine in their own home for 14 days.

Cancellation of some or all entry visas issued prior to COVID-19

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ The State of Emergency in Angola has been extended for a further period of 15 days from 11 April 2020 to 25 April 2020.
- ▶ All flights to Angola are therefore suspended and land borders are closed.
- ▶ The Angolan government may permit certain repatriation initiatives as it deems necessary.

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ Travelers allowed into the country will be quarantined for 14 days.

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ All borders were closed on 27 March 2020. Citizens and residents may not return until 26 April 2020 (extended from 12 April 2020), except in emergency health scenarios.
- ▶ Borders will be opened in a gradual, planned, and safe manner to ensure the safe return of Argentinians abroad.
- ▶ 8 land border crossings will open between 8 am and 4 pm, allowing 500 people daily entry.
- ▶ Ezeiza International Airport will be the only airport open to receive international flights. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs will continue to coordinate repatriation flights assigning different priority levels (age, chronic diseases, humanitarian reasons).

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ Travelers are required to self-isolate for 14 days.
- ▶ This measure will remain in effect until 26 April 2020 (extended from 12 April 2020),

New entry requirements for visa free nationals and/or visa applicants

Suspension or delays in issuance of new visas

Issuance of new visas and/or renewal of valid visas due to expire soon

- ▶ New visa issuance is currently suspended.

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ Australian citizens and permanent residents and their immediate family (spouses, dependents and legal guardians) will be permitted entry to Australia.
- ▶ Temporary visa holders are currently not permitted to enter Australia unless exemptions apply.
- ▶ Temporary visas include subclass 457 visas, Temporary Skill Shortage (TSS) subclass 482 visas, working holiday visas and student visas, as well as business and tourist visas.

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ All entrants will be required to self-isolate for 14 days after arrival.

Suspension of existing visas

Cancellation of some or all entry visas issued prior to COVID-19

Heightened admission or visa application criteria

New entry requirements for visa free nationals and/or visa applicants

- ▶ Temporary visa holders are currently not permitted to enter Australia unless exemptions apply. Travelers seeking a travel exemption must apply and be approved to travel by the Department of Home Affairs before traveling.

Suspension or delays in issuance of new visas

Issuance of new visas and/or renewal of valid visas due to expire soon

- ▶ Extended processing times are being experienced for some visa categories.

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ Flights from “crisis regions” have been suspended until further notice. This includes mainland China, Iran, South Korea, Italy, Switzerland, France, UK, Russia, Ukraine, and Spain.
- ▶ The Austrian borders with Slovakia, Czech Republic, Germany, Italy, and Slovenia are closed. Exceptions for travelers coming from Italy via car.
- ▶ Passenger trains to/from Italy have been suspended until further notice.

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

Suspension of existing visas

Cancellation of some or all entry visas issued prior to COVID-19

Heightened admission or visa application criteria

New entry requirements for visa free nationals and/or visa applicants

- ▶ Travelers who have been to mainland China, Iran, South Korea or Italy within 14 days prior to entry must obtain a medical clearance certificate from a doctor issued within the last four days.

Suspension or delays in issuance of new visas

Issuance of new visas and/or renewal of valid visas due to expire soon

- ▶ Austria has suspended the processing of all new visa applications.

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ Belgium has closed its borders to all non-essential travel.
- ▶ Schengen borders have been closed since 17 March 2020 for a period of 30 days to all foreign nationals except EU citizens and their family members (including UK citizens), long-term residents, diplomats, cross-border, healthcare workers, and people transporting goods.

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ Anyone that has been in contact with someone infected with COVID-19 will be requested to quarantine for 14 days.
- ▶ Effective 25 March 2020, anyone arriving by flight (as well as individuals picking the travelers up from the airport) will be requested to undergo a 14 day quarantine.

Cancellation of some or all entry visas issued prior to COVID-19

Heightened admission or visa application criteria

New entry requirements for visa free nationals and/or visa applicants

Suspension or delays in issuance of new visas

Issuance of new visas and/or renewal of valid visas due to expire soon

- ▶ Belgian consulates and embassies are not issuing new visas.

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ All borders are closed until 30 April 2020. Citizens and residents may return only in the event of a health or safety emergency.

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ A quarantine and curfew are currently in place until 30 April 2020 (extended from 15 April 2020).

Suspension of existing visas

Cancellation of some or all entry visas issued prior to COVID-19

Heightened admission or visa application criteria

New entry requirements for visa free nationals and/or visa applicants

Suspension or delays in issuance of new visas

Issuance of new visas and/or renewal of valid visas due to expire soon

- ▶ The issuance of new visas is currently suspended in-country.

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ As of 27 March 2020, foreigners, regardless of nationality or immigration status, are barred from entering Brazil by air or land for thirty days. Brazilian nationals and permanent residents are exempt of this entry restriction.

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ All newly admitted individuals are being asked to self-isolate for at least 7 days.
- ▶ Individuals with travel history into any of the following 16 countries are to be assessed for symptoms and may be isolated at a healthcare facility if symptomatic: Germany, Australia, United Arab Emirates, Philippines, France, Iran, Italy, Malaysia, Japan, Singapore, South Korea, North Korea, Thailand, Vietnam, Cambodia, and mainland China.
- ▶ Persons in contacts with individuals having traveled to the 16 countries above are asked to self-isolate for 14 days after possible exposure.

New entry requirements for visa free nationals and/or visa applicants

Suspension or delays in issuance of new visas

Issuance of new visas and/or renewal of valid visas due to expire soon

- ▶ Brazil visa application centers in mainland China are closed.

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ Canada's borders are closed to all foreign nationals with limited exceptions. Visitors and residents cannot enter Canada by land, sea or air for purposes such as tourism/entertainment.
- ▶ If traveling by air from any country other than the US, temporary residents are only allowed to board a flight to Canada if they qualify under an air travel exemption.
- ▶ If traveling by air from the United States, temporary residents are only allowed to board flights to Canada if they resided in Canada or the US for at least 14 days prior to their trip or if they qualify under an air travel exemption.

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ All international travelers must self-isolate for 14 days and contact health professionals immediately if experiencing COVID-19 symptoms.

Suspension of existing visas

Cancellation of some or all entry visas issued prior to COVID-19

Heightened admission or visa application criteria

New entry requirements for visa free nationals and/ or visa applicants

- ▶ Any traveler displaying COVID-19 symptoms will not be permitted to board a flight to Canada, regardless of citizenship.
- ▶ Travelers entering Canada by land with symptoms may still be admitted, but directed to self-quarantine for 14 days.
- ▶ Additional requirements may be imposed at the discretion of visa officers, including completing an immigration medical exam.

Suspension or delays in issuance of new visas

Issuance of new visas and/ or renewal of valid visas due to expire soon

- ▶ Immigration application processing times will take longer due to service reductions.

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ As of 18 March 2020, all borders and ports of entry are closed to foreign visitors until further notice. Chilean citizens and residents are exempt from this restriction and are permitted to enter the country.

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ As of 26 March 2020, the Chilean Government has declared a mandatory quarantine in some locations (Santiago, Araucanía, Ñuble, Los Lagos).
- ▶ Travelers are subject to 14 day quarantine upon entry. These measures do not apply to those who have only transited through the airports in such countries.

Suspension of existing visas

Cancellation of some or all entry visas issued prior to COVID-19

Heightened admission or visa application criteria

New entry requirements for visa free nationals and/or visa applicants

- ▶ International travelers are required to submit a sworn declaration listing the countries they have visited in the past 30 days.

Suspension or delays in issuance of new visas

Issuance of new visas and/or renewal of valid visas due to expire soon

- ▶ New visa issuance is currently suspended.

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ Borders are closed to most foreigners effective 28 March 2020, including holders of visas, residence permits and Asia Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) Business Travel Card (ABTC).
- ▶ The travel ban does not apply to permanent residents, holders of diplomatic / service / courtesy / C visas, or Hong Kong, Macau or Taiwan residents who enter with a Mainland China Travel Permit.
- ▶ Inbound flights schedules have been cut (one flight a week per airline per foreign country and passenger loads are restricted to 75%). International flights to Beijing must enter via one of 12 designated point of entry, and those to Shanghai can only land in Pudong International Airport.

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ All overseas visitors will undergo a 14-day quarantine. In some locations, e.g. Beijing, Shanghai and Guangdong Province, the quarantine needs to be centralized.

Suspension of existing visas

Cancellation of some or all entry visas issued prior to COVID-19

Heightened admission or visa application criteria

New entry requirements for visa free nationals and/ or visa applicants

- ▶ All passengers entering or departing mainland China are required to make health declarations and undergo checks by immigration officers.
- ▶ As of April 8 2020, Chinese nationals traveling to China mainland from over 25 countries are required to submit online health declarations on a daily basis for the last 14 days before their travel.
- ▶ As of 12 April 2020, travelers entering Beijing should have a health certificate issued within 7 days of entry, showing that the traveler tested negative to a local nucleic acid test. Their national health pass code or Beijing Health Kit certification status should state "no abnormality" before the travelers can check into a hotel.

Suspension or delays in issuance of new visas

Issuance of new visas and/ or renewal of valid visas due to expire soon

- ▶ The following are suspended until further notice: policies governing port visas, 24/72/144 hour visa free transit through mainland China, 30-day visa free travel to Hainan, 15-day visa free entry for foreign cruise members, 144 hour visa entry to Guangdong, and 15-day visa free entry to Guangzi.
- ▶ Foreigners entering for economic, trade, scientific, technology and emergency humanitarian reasons, as well as those entering to attend funerals, may apply for visas at embassies and consulates, and these requests will be processed on a case-by-case basis.

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ As of 17 March 2020, only Colombian citizens, as well as diplomats and foreign nationals with a migrant/resident/courtesy visa will be allowed entry by air to Colombia.
- ▶ All border crossings with Brazil, Peru, Panama, Ecuador and Venezuela are closed until 30 May 2020.

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ As of 8 April 2020, all individuals present in Colombia (citizens and visitors) are subject to home quarantine until 26 April 2020.

Suspension of existing visas

Cancellation of some or all entry visas issued prior to COVID-19

Heightened admission or visa application criteria

New entry requirements for visa free nationals and/or visa applicants

- ▶ Effective 27 March 2020, all foreigners applying for a Visitor Visa must have international health insurance valid for the duration of their visa.
- ▶ Foreigners applying for a Migrant Visa renewal must have a health social contribution certificate.

Suspension or delays in issuance of new visas

Issuance of new visas and/or renewal of valid visas due to expire soon

- ▶ New visa issuance is currently suspended.

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ Costa Rica declared a state of emergency on 23 March 2020. The admission of foreigners to the country is temporarily prohibited until 30 April 2020.
- ▶ All non-citizens who depart Costa Rica on or after 23 March 2020 will lose their immigration status, and will be required to re-apply to obtain their previously held status.
- ▶ Non-citizens who departed the country prior to this date will not have their immigration status revoked.

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ All new entrants to the country (including citizens) are being subjected to a mandatory 14 day isolation period.

Suspension of existing visas

Cancellation of some or all entry visas issued prior to COVID-19

Heightened admission or visa application criteria

New entry requirements for visa free nationals and/or visa applicants

Suspension or delays in issuance of new visas

Issuance of new visas and/or renewal of valid visas due to expire soon

- ▶ New visa issuance is currently suspended until 17 May 2020.

- ▶ The Schengen borders have been closed since 17 March 2020 for a period of 30 days to all foreign nationals except EU citizens and their family members (including UK citizens), long-term residents, diplomats, cross-border, healthcare workers, and people transporting goods.

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ Effective 12 March 2020, all foreign nationals traveling to Croatia from mainland China, Germany, Iran, Italy and South Korea are mandated to spend 14 days in official government quarantine facilities.

 - ▶ 4) Nationals of countries who are in a designated diplomatic service or mission under the Vienna convention.

Suspension or delays in issuance of new visas

Issuance of new visas and/ or renewal of valid visas due to expire soon

- ▶ The issuance of all entry permits, either for employment or studying purposes, is suspended.

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ Entry is currently prohibited for foreigners except those with permanent or temporary (over 90 days) residence in the Czech Republic (certain exceptions apply).

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ Most travelers arriving to the Czech Republic on or after 31 March 2020 must undergo a 14-day quarantine. Some exceptions apply.

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ All foreign nationals will be banned entry effective 14 March 2020 until 10 May 2020, with the exception of Danish citizens, Danish work and residency permit holders, and those deemed to have a critical purpose of travel.
- ▶ Effective 20 March 2020, only three land ports of entry between Germany and Denmark are operational: Sæd, Frøslev, and Kruså.

- ▶ All travelers will need to observe a 14 day quarantine period upon arrival.

- ▶ Flights from several locations, including locations in Italy, are currently canceled and could impact the entry of citizens, residents and visitors who are outside of Dominican Republic and seeking to enter the Dominican Republic.

- ▶ All individuals present in the Dominican Republic (citizens and foreigners) are subject to home quarantine until 30 April 2020 (extended from 18 April 2020). This date may be extended closer to the end of April.

Suspension of existing visas

Cancellation of some or all entry visas issued prior to COVID-19

- ▶ As Egypt has suspended flights in and out of all airports until 23 April 2020, visa holders (including individuals who are eligible for Visas on Arrival) are unable to enter with their visas during this time.

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ International air travel is limited to the Helsinki-Vantaa, Mararianhamina, and Turku airports.
- ▶ Only citizens and lawful residents of Finland are allowed entry at this time.
- ▶ New residence permit holders are only being permitted admission if the travel is considered "vital" to the needs of Finland.

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ All foreign nationals will be barred entry with the exception of:
 - (1) EU citizens (including UK citizens) and Schengen associated countries (EEA: Iceland, Norway, Liechtenstein; Switzerland) and their family members returning to their usual place of residence;
 - (2) Third-country nationals returning to their usual place of residence with a long-term residence permit (including national visas type D);
 - (3) Third-country nationals with so-called "essential functions";
 - (4) Health workers and researchers, individuals in the nursing profession; and
 - (5) Cross-border commuters, transport personnel in goods and other necessary areas (e.g. air crews).

- ▶ New visa issuance is currently suspended until further notice.

- ▶ Only Hong Kong residents with these documents will be allowed entry: Hong Kong Permanent Identity Cards; Hong Kong passports or British National (Overseas) Passports (with right of abode in Hong Kong); Hong Kong Identity Cards (accompanied with a valid work or study visa); or a work visa that is has not been activated.
- ▶ From 25 March 2020 until further notice, all non residents are denied entry for 14 days except those coming from mainland China, Taiwan or Macau who have not been to other jurisdictions in the last 14 days prior to entry; Macau residents registered under the Macau scheme; aircraft crew; government officials; spouses/minor children.

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ All persons (including Hong Kong residents) who have been to the following locations / regions in the past 14 days will be required to undergo a 14 day compulsory quarantine in a government-designated facility: mainland China (Hubei province), Iran, Italy (Emilia-Romagna, Lombardy and Veneto regions), South Korea (Daegu and Gyeongsangbuk-do)
- ▶ All other passengers who are eligible to enter Hong Kong will be required to undergo 14 days of compulsory quarantine, either at home or a hotel.

Suspension of existing visas

Cancellation of some or all entry visas issued prior to COVID-19

Heightened admission or visa application criteria

New entry requirements for visa free nationals and/ or visa applicants

- ▶ A health declaration form must be completed and submitted to the Hong Kong Department of Health on arrival if Hong Kong is the final destination. These forms will be distributed onboard all flights to Hong Kong. Alternatively passengers can submit their details by filling out an online form prior to departure. Upon completion, a QR code (valid for 24 hours) will be provided to present to officials on arrival.
- ▶ All ferry transfer services are suspended
- ▶ As of 25 March 2020 and until further notice, all transit through Hong Kong International Airport is suspended.

Suspension or delays in issuance of new visas

Issuance of new visas and/ or renewal of valid visas due to expire soon

- ▶ Effective 23 March 2020 and until further notice, the government is still accepting certain applications, including visa applications for Extensions of Stay and Changes of Sponsor (excluding those for Mainland Chinese nationals)
- ▶ The Employment, Dependent, Training and Visitor Visas Section had suspended their services from as of 23 March 2020 and until further notice.
- ▶ Partial services may be suspended with no advance notice, and this is subject to the volume of applications received by the authorities
- ▶ All Extension of Stay applications are only being accepted for visas expiring within one month from the date of application submission.

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ Third country nationals, including those with a valid Hungarian residence permit, are prohibited from entering, with the exception of the following:
 - (1) Close relatives (spouse, parents) of Hungarian citizens and who possess valid a Hungarian residence permit; and
 - (2) EU citizens holding a Hungarian "Permanent Residence Card" ("Állandó tartózkodási kártya").
- ▶ EU citizens holding a "Registration Certificate for EEA citizens" ("Regisztrációs igazolás EGT állampolgár részére") are prohibited entry.

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ Hungarian nationals and EEA nationals with permanent residence are subject to health screening and quarantine or self-isolation as determined by the authorities.

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ Indian nationals abroad have been advised to stay put and not travel.
- ▶ All passengers traveling from the EU, EEA, Afghanistan, Malaysia, Philippines, Turkey and the United Kingdom are banned from entering India.
- ▶ All international commercial aircrafts are prohibited to land in India effective 22 March 2020 until 3 May 2020.

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ All incoming travelers, including Indian nationals, who arrived prior to the lockdown from mainland China, Italy, Iran, Republic of Korea, France, Spain, Germany, UAE, Qatar, Oman and Kuwait were subject to quarantine for a minimum of 14 days.

Suspension of existing visas

Cancellation of some or all entry visas issued prior to COVID-19

- ▶ All existing visas issued to nationals that have not already entered India has been suspended from 13 March 2020 until 15 April 2020 - except for those issued to Diplomats, Official passport holders, those in UN / International organizations, those on Employment, Project visas and those who are operating aircrew of scheduled airlines.
- ▶ Visas issued to foreign nationals currently in India remain valid. For extensions/conversions, the application can be filed with the nearest Foreign Regional Registration Office /Foreign Regional Registration Office.
- ▶ Visa free travel by Overseas Citizenship of India card holders that are not currently in India is suspended until 3 May 2020.

- ▶ Medical Help and Support Staff, Food and Humanitarian reasons, Transportation Crews, and foreigners who are working on a national strategic project.
- ▶ The above individuals may enter Indonesia after fulfilling the requirements noted in the column titled "Heightened admission or visa application criteria."

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ Indonesian citizens will need to undertake an additional screening carried out by the Port Health Authority upon arrival. Travelers who show symptoms of COVID-19 are subject to a 14-day observation period in a government facility. If no symptoms are observed, a 14-day self-quarantine is strongly recommended.

- ▶ ITAS, ITAP and visit visa holders currently in Indonesia whose permit has expired and/or cannot be extended will be granted with an automatic forced state stay permit at no cost, without applying for it with the immigration office.
- ▶ When the COVID-19 pandemic is declared over by the authorized institution, the extension of stay permit process will follow the standard regulation.
- ▶ Under this condition, employers are currently released from the obligation to submit a deregistration application of stay permit of foreigners to the Immigration office.

- ▶ Work permit and work visa extension applications are currently delayed.
- ▶ Most overseas Israeli consulates provide emergency services only, canceling many previously scheduled appointments, and foreign nationals will need to provide evidence that their lives are based in Israel.

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ Special entry regulations are in effect until 3 May 2020 (extended from 13 April 2020).
- ▶ All unnecessary travel to Italy should be avoided.
- ▶ Special entry regulations in The validity of residence permits (permessi di soggiorno) with an expiration date between 31 January 2020 and 15 April 2020 has been extended to 15 June 2020.
- ▶ This extension does not apply to foreigners who are outside of Italy. Residence permit holders who currently are outside of Italy are advised to speak with their immigration providers to discuss the best option for re-entry to Italy.

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

- ▶ As of 28 March 2020, all travelers are required to carry a detailed form declaring their reasons for travel, the address where they will be quarantined in Italy, and other info.
- ▶ Airline carriers will check passengers' temperature and if it is higher than 37.5°C they will not be allowed to board.
- ▶ After admission to Italy, travelers will be subject to self-quarantine in their home or hotel for 14 to 28 days and required to submit a notification of entrance to the health authorities (A.S.L. or A.T.S.).
- ▶ Only business trips lasting up to 72 hours (extendable for 48 hours for serious reasons) are exempted from self-quarantine measures provided no COVID-19 symptoms are shown.

- ▶ Foreign nationals who hold Chinese passports issued in Hubei or Zhejiang Province;
- ▶ Foreigners on cruise ships that departed from Hong Kong.

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ Travelers entering by air or ship from the following (regardless of nationality) will have to undergo a 14 days quarantine: Andorra, mainland China, Korea, Ireland, Iran, United Kingdom, Egypt, Cyprus, Croatia, San Marino, Vatican, Bulgaria, Monaco, Romania, United States, Indonesia, Singapore, Thailand, Philippines, Brunei, Vietnam, Malaysia, Israel, Qatar, Congo (Dem. Rep.), Bahrain and the Schengen member states (Iceland, Italy, Estonia, Austria, Netherlands, Switzerland, Greece, Sweden, Spain, Malta, Slovakia, Slovenia, Czech Republic, Denmark, Germany, Norway, Hungary, Finland, France, Belgium, Poland, Portugal, Latvia, Lithuania, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg).

Suspension of existing visas

Cancellation of some or all entry visas issued prior to COVID-19

- ▶ Previously issued short-term entry visas (single and multiple entry) issued in mainland China and South Korea are suspended and invalidated, as are work visas issued under Certificates of Eligibility upon initial entry into Japan.
- ▶ Travelers (regardless of nationality) from the following countries who hold a single or multiple-entry Japanese visa that was issued prior to 20 March 2020 are not be permitted to enter Japan using that visa: Schengen member states, Andorra, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Egypt, Iran, Ireland, Monaco, Romania, San Marino, the United Kingdom, the Vatican.

Heightened admission or visa application criteria

New entry requirements for visa free nationals and/ or visa applicants

- ▶ Visa exemptions have been suspended for nationals of over 40 jurisdictions, including Hong Kong, Macau, Republic of Korea, Indonesia, Singapore, Thailand, Brunei, Vietnam, Malaysia and many European jurisdictions.
- ▶ Visa exemptions granted by the Japanese Government to APEC Business Travel Card (ABTC) holders issued by the following are also suspended: Brunei, mainland China, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Republic of Korea, Malaysia, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand and Vietnam.

- ▶ EU land borders are closed to commercial passenger vehicles, but personal vehicles of Latvian citizens and residents will be permitted to cross.
- ▶ The borders with Russia and Belarus are closed for all passenger travel.

- ▶ As of 18 March 2020, all non-Omani nationals are barred entry to the Sultanate until further notice. This includes Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) citizens and foreign nationals holding valid tourist, business and residency visas. Airport transit remains unaffected. Foreign nationals are permitted to depart Oman during this time.

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ As of 17 March 2020, all travelers entering Oman from all points of entry (land, sea, air) including Omani citizens will be placed under mandatory quarantine.

Suspension of existing visas

- ▶ Current valid visas that were issued previously are not formally suspended, however visa holders are subject to the current bar on entry to Oman.

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ Foreign nationals in possession of the following visa categories are banned from entering:
 - ▶ Those under Visa Waiver Agreements (i.e., AJACS, AJACSSUK, FSC);
 - ▶ Special Visas (i.e., SRRV, SIRV, ABTC and economic zone visas);
 - ▶ Those who falls under Executive Order No. 408, s. 1960 (non-visa required countries under EO408);
 - ▶ Holders of Hong Kong, Macau, Macau-Portugese and British National Overseas passports;
 - ▶ Immigrant and Non-Immigrant Visas (9g visa, 9d visa, 47(a)(2), E0226).

- ▶ Citizens and lawful residents are exempt from this ban.

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ As of 15 March 2020, holders of previously issued (valid) visas are restricted from entry to the Kingdom until further notice.
- ▶ As of 25 March 2020, travel between Riyadh, Mecca and Madinat has been prohibited.
- ▶ While the authorities have indicated that there may be some exceptions to flight suspensions, these are likely to be made on a case-by-case basis. Some countries - including the US, UK and Egypt - have begun organizing repatriation flights for their nationals.

- ▶ All short-term travel and transit is currently prohibited.

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ Singapore citizens, residents and long term pass holders are being placed on mandatory 14-day Stay Home Notices (SHN) from their arrival date.
- ▶ Travelers who visited, or traveled from, the Hubei province are being issued 14-day Quarantine Orders (QO) upon arrival in Singapore

Suspension of existing visas

Cancellation of some or all entry visas issued prior to COVID-19

- ▶ Previously issued visas for all short-term visitors have been suspended.

Heightened admission or visa application criteria

New entry requirements for visa free nationals and/ or visa applicants

- ▶ Foreign employees (including in-principle approval holders, existing work pass holders) and accompanying family members will require an approval from the MOM prior to travel. Approval will only be granted for individuals from sectors that provide essential services such as healthcare and transport. The request for approval must be submitted online (via Forms SG) to the MOM ahead of the planned arrival date.
- ▶ Effective 27 March 2020, all travelers must file online health declarations before receiving immigration clearance.
- ▶ All counter services at the MOM's work pass services center will be suspended from 7 April to 4 May 2020, and are subject to further changes.

Suspension or delays in issuance of new visas

Issuance of new visas and/ or renewal of valid visas due to expire soon

- ▶ Visa issuance for all short-term visitors, including any visa free transit facilities, have been suspended. New work pass applications for Chinese nationals continue to be rejected.
- ▶ Approvals for any new applications will be very limited in light of the new adjustments implemented by the MOM on their work pass services.

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ Slovakia has closed its borders to tourists and other visitors.
- ▶ Only Slovak citizens, permanent and temporary residents (e.g., residence permit card holders), close relatives (spouse, minor child, parent of minor child), cross-border workers (with confirmation from employer) and diplomatic personnel are allowed entry.

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ Effective 6 April 2020, all citizens and foreigners entering Slovakia are to be isolated in state quarantine centers until such time that a negative COVID-19 diagnosis is obtained.
- ▶ Exceptions to Isolation in state quarantine centers are available for pregnant women, persons with oncological disease or serious immunity disorder, among others.
- ▶ Isolation in state quarantine centers does not apply to unaccompanied minors entering Slovakia. These individuals are obliged to stay in domestic isolation for 14 days.

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ Foreigners, irrespective of visa status, are prohibited from entering South Africa from designated "high risk" countries, including mainland China, France, Germany, Iran, Italy, Korea (Rep.), Spain, Switzerland, the UK or the US.

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ Newly admitted individuals are subject to comprehensive testing/screening, isolation and quarantine measures.
- ▶ South Africa is under a state of national lockdown from 27 March 2020 until 16 April 2020.

- ▶ Visas that were previously issued but have not been used to enter the country are revoked/canceled with immediate effect.

- ▶ Expanding on previous quarantine measures, as of 1 April 2020, South Korea is enforcing a 14 day mandatory COVID-19 quarantine for all entrants from overseas.
- ▶ All entrants to the country, regardless of their nationality, should stay in 14-day-quarantine.
- ▶ Visitors without local addresses (no hotel/guest house) in South Korea should stay in government-designated facilities at their own expense.

Suspension of existing visas

Cancellation of some or all entry visas issued prior to COVID-19

- ▶ Any permits (short-term or long term) already issued to Japanese nationals are no longer valid except for alien registration/residential card holders.
- ▶ As of 13 April 2020, short-term visit visas (C-3) issued on or before 5 April 2020 are no longer valid for applicants that have not entered South Korea.

Heightened admission or visa application criteria

New entry requirements for visa free nationals and/ or visa applicants

- ▶ All Japanese nationals must now obtain a visa to enter South Korea and they are required to submit a health check declaration among other documents as part of the application.
- ▶ Suspension of the visa-free entry and visa waiver program as of 13 April 2020 for multiple nationalities. Travelers are strongly recommended to check with their immigration services provider prior to booking their travel. The visa-free entry and visa waiver program is still open to US, UK, Mexico, Ireland and Slovenia nationals.

Suspension or delays in issuance of new visas

Issuance of new visas and/ or renewal of valid visas due to expire soon

- ▶ Visa issuance for foreigners from mainland China have been restricted.
- ▶ Visa-free-policy for Chinese nationals transiting through South Korea has been suspended.
- ▶ Landing visas in Jeju Island have been suspended.
- ▶ The Visa Waiver Program for Japanese nationals has been suspended.
- ▶ Applications submitted by Japanese nationals that have not already been processed are canceled, and applicants will need to submit a new application.

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ As of 23 March 2020, admission to Spain may only be granted to certain groups, including:
 - ▶ Spanish citizens and residents
 - ▶ Residents of the European Union or Schengen States, who go directly to their place of residence.
 - ▶ Holders of a long-term visa issued by an EU Member State or Schengen State
 - ▶ Cross-border workers.
 - ▶ Personnel dedicated to the transport of goods, in the exercise of their work activity and the flight personnel necessary to carry out commercial air transport activities.
 - ▶ Diplomatic, consular, international, military and humanitarian organizations personnel, in the exercise of their functions.

- ▶ Exceptions are being made for those foreign nationals returning home to Sweden.

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ Individuals are being asked to self-quarantine if they are showing COVID-19 symptoms.

Suspension of existing visas

Cancellation of some or all entry visas issued prior to COVID-19

Heightened admission or visa application criteria

New entry requirements for visa free nationals and/or visa applicants

- ▶ Visit/business visas will not be issued to those who are impacted by the entry ban.

Suspension or delays in issuance of new visas

Issuance of new visas and/or renewal of valid visas due to expire soon

- ▶ There are widespread delays in issuance of visas as consular posts are closed or are operating with reduced staff.

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ Entering Switzerland, holding a permanent residence card (permit C) is possible.
- ▶ Entry to Switzerland, regardless of nationality and point of origin is only possible for those with a valid D-visa (national visa) for work purposes; or a valid L, B, G or C permit or a valid announcement confirmation.
- ▶ Entry for business and tourism is currently not permitted. Non-EU nationals with a Schengen Visa (C-visa) are not allowed to enter Switzerland.
- ▶ The Swiss Government has extended its COVID-19 restrictions and the entry ban will remain in effect until 26 April 2020 for all countries except Liechtenstein.

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ In general there are no quarantine / self isolation measures in place. However, individuals showing COVID-19 symptoms may be denied entry or subject to isolation in a healthcare facility.

Suspension of existing visas

Cancellation of some or all entry visas issued prior to COVID-19

- ▶ Non-EU nationals with a Schengen Visa (C-visa) are not allowed to enter Switzerland.
- ▶ Non-EU nationals with a valid D Visa are still allowed entry.

Heightened admission or visa application criteria

New entry requirements for visa free nationals and/ or visa applicants

- ▶ Switzerland is no longer issuing Schengen visas (C) for 90 days.
- ▶ National visas (D) will only be issued in exceptional cases, for example to family members of Swiss citizens with a right of presence in Switzerland who require a visa and to specialists from the health sector. In practice, this means that Swiss authorities will not be issuing any visa authorizations for non-EU nationals for the time being. This will affect all 120 day-, L- and B-permit applications for non-EU nationals.

Suspension or delays in issuance of new visas

Issuance of new visas and/ or renewal of valid visas due to expire soon

- ▶ The labor market authorities in Aargau, Lucerne, Solothurn, St. Gallen, Ticino, Vaud, Zug and Zurich will no longer process new applications for EU nationals. Exceptions are being made for individuals already in Switzerland. The canton of Geneva will still proceed with G permit applications.
- ▶ As of 18 March 2020, national visas will also only be issued in exceptional cases, for example to family members of Swiss citizens with a right of presence in Switzerland who require a visa and to specialists from the health sector.

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ The following individuals are barred from entering Taiwan:
 - (1) Mainland Chinese nationals except for spouses of Taiwan citizens with resident permits
 - (2) Foreign nationals who visited/resided in mainland China, Hong Kong, Macau within previous 14 days without ARC or special approval/permit; and
 - (3) Hong Kong and Macau passport holders except for holders of Taiwan Entry Permit for contractual activities, employment and dependents of Taiwanese.
- ▶ Transit through Taiwan is suspended until 30 April 2020

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ All passengers entering Taiwan are required to be on home quarantine for 14 days upon entry into Taiwan.

Suspension of existing visas

Cancellation of some or all entry visas issued prior to COVID-19

- ▶ Visa/entry permit issuance for Mainland Chinese nationals is suspended.
- ▶ All visa applications by foreign nationals with travel history to mainland China, Hong Kong and Macau in the past 14 days will not be accepted.
- ▶ Online entry visa applications submitted by Hong Kong and Macau passport holders will not be accepted (e.g. entry permit, online visa, landing visa).
- ▶ Dependent visa issuance is suspended for the most part.
- ▶ Visas are only being issued to personnel on diplomatic or official business, persons who are fulfilling commercial and contractual obligations, and persons with special permission.

Heightened admission or visa application criteria

New entry requirements for visa free nationals and/or visa applicants

Suspension or delays in issuance of new visas

Issuance of new visas and/or renewal of valid visas due to expire soon

- ▶ Visas issued prior to 19 March 2020 are suspended and no longer valid unless issued with a special notation "special entry permit for COVID-19"

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ As of 11 April 2020, all non essential commercial flights to Tanzania have been suspended. Essential flights are permitted as determined by the Tanzanian government, however crew members will be subject to quarantine restrictions.

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ All travelers coming in the country are put in quarantine for 14 days in specific locations designated by the Government.
- ▶ All persons who have come into contact with persons who have tested positive for COVID-19 are kept in quarantine for the period of 14 days. If impacted individuals do not show any signs of the disease after the expiry of the 14 day period, such individuals are released from quarantine. Those who test positive will only be released upon full recovery.
- ▶ The Government is urging everyone to observe protective measures against COVID-19.

- ▶ All foreigners are banned from entering Thailand until 30 April 2020. This ban covers all port of entry, land, air and sea, with exceptions for carriers of cargo, pilots and crews who are scheduled to leave Thailand immediately, diplomats and families, foreigners who currently hold valid long term Thai work permits and Thai nationals.
- ▶ Thai nationals who are outside of Thailand may re-enter provided they obtain a health certificate indicating they are COVID-19 free and submit an "Intent to Return Form" from the Royal Thai Embassy, Thai Consulate Office in the country of departure in accordance with the guideline issued by the Civil Aviation Authority of Thailand.
- ▶ Those requiring a Fit to Fly Health Certificate must carry a certificate issued no more than 72 hours before traveling.

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ All airline passengers are subject to a 14 days quarantine upon arrival in Thailand.
- ▶ Foreigners are to be quarantined at private residences or designated hotels.
- ▶ Thai citizens must implement self-quarantine measures at their own residence.

Suspension of existing visas

Cancellation of some or all entry visas issued prior to COVID-19

- ▶ Holders of several types of Thai visas were issued prior to the COVID-19 outbreak (including Tourist, Retirement, Student, Guardian, Non Immigrant B Visa and WP3 or BOI Approval Letter, Non O Visa, Elite Card) are not allowed entry by the Immigration Bureau until at least 30 April 2020.

Heightened admission or visa application criteria

New entry requirements for visa free nationals and/ or visa applicants

- ▶ All foreigners are banned from entering Thailand until 30 April 2020. This ban covers all port of entry, land, air and sea, with the exceptions for carriers of cargo, pilots and crews who are scheduled to leave Thailand immediately, diplomats and families, foreigners who currently hold valid long term Thai work permits and Thai nationals.

Suspension or delays in issuance of new visas

Issuance of new visas and/ or renewal of valid visas due to expire soon

- ▶ All foreigners are banned from entering Thailand until 30 April 2020. This ban covers all port of entry, land, air and sea, with the exceptions for carriers of cargo, pilots and crews who are scheduled to leave Thailand immediately, diplomats and families, foreigners who currently hold valid long term Thai work permits and Thai nationals.

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ As of 21 March 2020, Uganda is in lockdown. No travel is currently allowed into or out of the country.
- ▶ Foreigners currently in Uganda cannot depart Uganda and no repatriation initiatives are being allowed at present.

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ 14 day mandatory isolation and quarantine measures are imposed on travelers that entered Uganda before the lockdown

Suspension of existing visas

Cancellation of some or all entry visas issued prior to COVID-19

- ▶ In light of the current prohibition on entry to, and exit from Uganda, holders of previously issued, valid visas may not use those visas to enter the country at this time.

Heightened admission or visa application criteria

New entry requirements for visa free nationals and/ or visa applicants

Suspension or delays in issuance of new visas

Issuance of new visas and/ or renewal of valid visas due to expire soon

- ▶ Applications will still be accepted online but delays can be expected in processing due to the COVID-19 lockdown.

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ All travelers who enter the UAE must undergo 14 days of mandatory self-quarantine effective 18 March 2020.

Suspension of existing visas

Cancellation of some or all entry visas issued prior to COVID-19

- ▶ Residency Visas and Emirates IDs that expired after 1 March 2020 are automatically extended without any additional fees until 31 December 2020, whether or not the document holder is currently in or outside of the United Arab Emirates.

Heightened admission or visa application criteria

New entry requirements for visa free nationals and/ or visa applicants

- ▶ Effective 29 March 2020 and until further notice, the medical test report issued by the Dubai Health Authority will no longer be required to process Mainland visa applications.
- ▶ In respect of new in-country visa applications which are in process either via Dubai Mainland or Freezone, delays are expected with respect to visa stamping and subsequent issuance of Emirates IDs (which is required for all expats and dependents).

Suspension or delays in issuance of new visas

Issuance of new visas and/ or renewal of valid visas due to expire soon

- ▶ No new visas are being processed at this time, including work and business visas.

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ British nationals traveling abroad are being advised by the government to return to the UK.
- ▶ If the individual is a permanent resident overseas, she/he should remain and follow the advice of the local authorities.

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ All travelers must self isolate for 14 days if they or anyone in their household is displaying COVID-19 symptoms.
- ▶ A period of social isolation is currently enforced. Individuals are only to leave their homes for essential purposes such as purchasing food or medicine, accessing medical treatment, exercise (once per day), critical business/work activities which cannot be completed remotely.
- ▶ Public gatherings of more than two people are banned as well, excluding the people with whom the individual lives.

Suspension of existing visas

Cancellation of some or all entry visas issued prior to COVID-19

- ▶ The Home Office has released updated guidance for those currently in the UK with visas expiring on or before 31 May 2020. For more information, see: <https://www.gov.uk/guidance/coronavirus-COVID-19-advice-for-uk-visa-applicants-and-temporary-uk-residents>.

Heightened admission or visa application criteria

New entry requirements for visa free nationals and/or visa applicants

Suspension or delays in issuance of new visas

Issuance of new visas and/or renewal of valid visas due to expire soon

- ▶ The majority of UK visa application centers are closed globally. Please refer to <https://www.gov.uk/find-a-visa-application-center> for a full list of closures.
- ▶ Applications are being accepted online but delays can be expected.
- ▶ The Home Office is not currently supporting 'priority service' applications overseas, which will result in delays in the issuance of UK visas.

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ Travelers that have been to mainland China, Iran, the United Kingdom, Ireland, or Schengen area countries (EU) in the 14 days prior to seeking admission to the US will be refused entry. This excludes US Citizens, US Lawful Permanent Residents, and members of the US armed forces and their immediate family members.
- ▶ Travelers entering the U.S by land from Canada or Mexico for “non-essential” purposes will be refused entry. The U.S. has declined to fully define “non-essential” apart from excluding any travel related to tourism or recreation. The U.S. has also closed its land border with Mexico to any undocumented applicants (impacting asylum and refugee seekers).

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ US citizens and Lawful Permanent Residents entering the US from a restricted country will be subject to enhanced entry screening and directed to proceed to their final destination, and immediately home-quarantine in accordance with Center of Disease Control best practices.

Suspension of existing visas

Cancellation of some or all entry visas issued prior to COVID-19

Heightened admission or visa application criteria

New entry requirements for visa free nationals and/ or visa applicants

- ▶ The Department of State (DOS) has temporarily suspended all routine immigrant and non-immigrant visa appointments as of 20 March 2020.
- ▶ The DOS is currently limiting visa processing to emergencies, which are fairly narrowly defined as including urgent medical care for oneself or for a relative or employer that must be accompanied; a funeral/death; urgent business travel; or students or exchange visitors.
- ▶ Special procedures for making the emergency visa request must be followed.

Suspension or delays in issuance of new visas

Issuance of new visas and/ or renewal of valid visas due to expire soon

- ▶ The Department of State has temporarily suspended all routine immigrant and nonimmigrant visa appointments as of 20 March 2020. A future date for reopening these services has not been announced.

Entry restrictions

Measures designed to prohibit or reduce entry to the jurisdiction

- ▶ All inbound international flights have been suspended.
- ▶ All foreign nationals will be barred entry starting on 22 March 2020 with the exception of those entering for diplomatic, official and other extraordinary purposes (including foreign guests attending or otherwise in service of important foreign affairs events, experts, corporate managers, high skilled workers).
- ▶ The Vietnam - Cambodia border closed effective 20 March 2020 until further notice.

Quarantines/ Isolation measures

Mandatory measures to prevent the spread of infection in new arrivals

- ▶ All passengers, with the exception of diplomats and officials, will need to undergo 14 days of quarantine.
