In India, only 15.8% of the workforce is employed in the organized sector. In such circumstances, the country needs to adopt a wide range of frameworks to ensure good health and safety. Safety is not a choice or an option to be bifurcated between top floors and shop floors. Good HSE management helps an organization to achieve its goal of excellence. The Zero Harm vision in the ESG model can be achieved today with the help of a connected workforce.
