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Canada's federal budget 2023/24 discussed

On 28 March, Federal Finance Minister Chrystia Freeland tabled the 2023/24 budget. This budget focuses on several priorities, including providing targeted inflation relief for Canadians most in need and other affordability measures to support students, seniors, small businesses and the middle class; building more affordable housing; investing in public health care, including implementing the new Canadian Dental Care Plan; and making significant investments to support Canada's transition to a clean economy while also

supporting the creation of good jobs for Canadians.

Canada: New Brunswick issues budget 2023/24

On 21 March 2023, New Brunswick Minister of Finance and Treasury Board Ernie Steeves tabled the province's fiscal 2023/24 budget. The budget contains no new taxes and no tax increases.

Canada: Saskatchewan issues budget 2023/24

On 22 March 2023, Saskatchewan Finance Minister Donna Harpauer tabled the province's fiscal 2023/24 budget. The budget contains tax measures affecting individuals and corporations. The Minister anticipates a surplus of CA\$1.018 billion for 2023/24 and projects small surpluses for each of the next three years.

Peruvian Government modifies minimum interest rate allowed for national and foreign currency loans

A new Peruvian legislative decree modifies the minimum interest rate allowed for loans in local and foreign currency, given that LIBOR rates will no longer be published. The decree will be effective as of 1 January 2024.

Costa Rican Executive Branch publishes regulations on law to promote investment competitiveness outside the greater metropolitan area

The Costa Rican Executive Branch recently published six new Executive Decrees intended to regulate provisions of a law aimed at promoting investment competitiveness outside of the greater metropolitan area. The new regulations will be of interest to companies that are looking to make new investments and want to apply for the benefits of the free trade zone regime outside of the greater metropolitan area.

Costa Rican inactive entities must file their informative return on new form D-195 by 31 May 2023

The Costa Rican tax authority has extended the due date for inactive entities (i.e., those with no economic activity) to file Form D-195 to 31 May from 30 April.

Panama implements major changes in work permit regulations as of 1 April 2023

On 1 April 2023, Panama's immigration framework will undergo major changes, including a restructuring of work permit categories, updated application processing times and new conditions for filing extension applications.



US IRS official says enhanced IRS pre-filing process will provide taxpayers with a more robust view of APA suitability

The Acting Deputy Commissioner of the US Internal Revenue Service's Large Business and International Division said that the IRS plans to implement a new process for taxpayers considering applying for an Advance Pricing Agreement (APA). Under this new process, the IRS and taxpayer will engage early on so the IRS can provide feedback to the taxpayer on whether the proposed transactions to be covered in an APA would be best resolved in the APA program or some other process, such as the International Compliance Assurance Programme.

United States | March 2023 COVID-related immigration updates

On 23 March 2023, US Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) announced the end of the COVID-19 flexibilities for responding to requests, notices, and decisions issued in connection with certain immigration benefits and programs.

USCIS announces completion of H-1B initial electronic registration selection process

On 27 March 2023, US Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) announced that it has received enough electronic registrations to reach the FY 2024 H-1B numerical allocations. Prospective petitioners with selected registrations may file FY 2024 H-1B cap-subject petitions, including those petitions eligible for the advanced degree exemption, with USCIS beginning 1 April 2023.

Brazil reinstates visa requirements for Australia, Canada, Japan and US nationals

Effective 1 October, nationals of Australia, Canada, Japan and the US will be required to obtain a visa prior to entering Brazil for business, tourism and other purposes. Additional details including application requirements, processing times and visa validity periods are expected to be released by the Brazilian Ministry of Foreign Affairs in the near future.

OECD holds public consultation meeting on compliance and tax certainty aspects of Pillar Two global minimum tax

On 16 March 2023, the OECD held a virtual consultation meeting on the public consultation documents that had been released by the OECD Secretariat on 20 December 2022 on the Pillar Two GloBE information return and on tax certainty for the Pillar Two GloBE rules in connection with the ongoing OECD/G20 project on *Addressing the Tax Challenges Arising from the Digitalisation of the Economy* (the so-called BEPS 2.0 project). During the consultation meeting, three panels of business representatives and an academic discussed tax certainty and two panels of business representatives discussed the GloBE information return.
